J The total premium you paid to CBHS Health Fund in 2021-22 split between each adult on your cover. It does not include Lifetime Health Cover loading

The following information is relevant to the completion of your 2022 income tax return

The table below provides details of your 2021-22 private health insurance policy. If your policy has more than one Private Health Insurance Incentive Beneficiary, this statement will only display your share amounts.

The Australian Government determines the way the Rebate is calculated and applied to premiums. Rebate percentages are adjusted on 1 April each year. If you paid premiums for your policy before and on or after 1 April, the table below will contain at least two lines of information. Where more than one line of information has been provided, the information from each line must be entered separately at the corresponding labels on the income tax return at **private health insurance policy details**.

You will need to nominate a tax claim code when completing the private health insurance policy details section of your tax return. Read the tax return instructions to determine the tax claim code appropriate for your situation.

M2 Medicare Levy Surcharge

If you and all your dependants (including your spouse) did not have an appropriate level of private patient hospital cover for the full financial year (365 days) you may be liable for the Medicare Levy Surcharge – see 2022 Individual tax return instructions question M2.
